



Highlights of the 2045 Plan Survey – conducted in July/August 2020

- I would love to see roads throughout the city improved. I would also like to see the Forest Service and counties work to improve the roads into the mountains. Once the national forest is free from snow, you can't drive to various areas without 4 wheel drive as mudders and atvs have ruined the roads for regular cars. This pushes forest use to the same areas resulting in crowding and overuse of areas.
- Improve bicycle routes and safety especially for kids
- Commute from Pendleton into work in WW, survey doesn't really take that into account at beginning Thank you for all you do to improve transportation in Walla Walla Valley!
- Public Transportation is essential for individuals with disabilities in our community. 80% of people die with some disability, the disability community represents approximately 20% of a population. These systems, in order to serve them best, need a keen eye on accessibility, lighting, safety, and inter agency communication/synchronization. Increase participation from individuals that routinely use public transportation, or from bicyclists. A deterrent for us in buying a home were the lack of sidewalks in many of the blocks in WW. There needs to be sidewalks (on both sides of the street) in a mile radius from every elementary school in WW (the radius that determines if a child is walking to school or provided a bus). Check out 2nd street as it turns into Abbott. There is a suburb within a mile radius, but without a sidewalk on some of the busier spots on the route to Prospect Point.
- Completion of Highway 12 Phase 7 and 8 is a high priority.
